

# BEAR FLAG WAVES OVER THE SENATE

White Slave and Seamen's  
Bills Passed Yesterday in  
Upper House.

The Bear flag, for which the natives of the state have a wholesome and tender regard, waved over the senate yesterday in its first session of real accomplishment. The flag wasn't there in silk and anallnes, but floated figuratively and far, with a unanimous vote that it be declared the official state flag. Joseph L. Coughlin, the sergeant-at-arms of the senate, was about to undrape the Bear flag when the senate adjourned on him.

The flag was adopted along with a bill by Senator Holohan naming that bunting as the official banner of the state. The bill was backed up by the Native Sons and Native Daughters.
