AN ACT

TO SELECT AND ADOPT THE BEAR FLAG AS THE STATE FLAG OF CALIFORNIA.

The people of the State of California, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The bear flag is hereby selected and adopted as
2 the state flag of California.

SEC. 2. The said bear flag shall consist of a flag of a length
2 equal to one and one-half the width thereof; the upper five-
3 sixth of the width thereof to be a white field, and the lower
4 sixth of the width thereof to be a red stripe; there shall appear
5 in the white field in the upper left hand corner a single red
6 star, and at the bottom of the white field the words "California
7 Republic," and in the center of the white field a California
8 grizzly bear upon a grass plat, in the position of walking to-
9 wards the left of the said field; said bear shall be dark brown
10 in color and in length, equal to one-third of the length of said
11 flag.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in full force and effect from and
2 after its passage.
